Uniform Policy

Our school has a strict uniform policy. We believe it is important that students learn to dress smartly and appropriately. Students are expected to wear their uniform with pride.

If a student is not in full uniform, they will not be allowed in the mainstream lessons, instead they will be kept in isolation until the matter is resolved; we shall contact parents and endeavour to try to find the uniform items until the parents arrive; if a student is not wearing correct shoes, they will be given replacement plimsolls on loan to allow them into mainstream lessons.

SHOES

School shoes should be black, flat and logo-free. Trainers, boots, including ankle boots, suede and logos are not allowed at school. All shoes that are considered to be trainer-like in appearance are not allowed. As a general rule footwear with Velcro fasteners, patterned or prints, overly elaborate buckles or other embellishments are unacceptable and therefore, not permitted. To avoid all confusion please stick as closely as possible to the shoe styles shown below.



TROUSERS

Students are not to wear sport trousers or skinny leg trousers. Trousers must be plain black and loose.



HEADSCARVES

Headscarves worn for religious purposes should be black, with absolutely no patterns, embellishments, fringing or tassels. They should be tucked into the school shirt and the entire shirt collar and school tie must be visible at all times. Styles which give extra height and volume are not acceptable.

All students are required to wear a belt which should be plain, black, leather or leather-look; buckles must be simple and under-stated. No branding or logos are allowed.

HAIR

Hair must be in a conventional style. Examples of unacceptable styles include: patterns shaved into a student's hair or eyebrows, hair dyed unnatural colours. Hairstyles must always look professional.

Hair bands or slides should be completely plain in black. Bows, flowers or other adornments are not permitted.

MAKE-UP

Students in Year 7 to 11 must not wear any make-up whatsoever. If found to be wearing make-up of any description students will be asked to remove it immediately. Failure to do so will result in immediate isolation. Nail varnish of any description, nail extensions and henna decorations are also forbidden.

JEWELLERY

- No earrings or ear studs of any sort
- No piercings of any sort anywhere
- No bracelets
- No rings
- No necklaces or chains

If a student is wearing any form of jewellery they will be obliged to remove it immediately and it will be confiscated for five working days. There will be NO exceptions to this rule.

We do allow watches, which should be plain and functional. Oversized fashion watches, watches in garish colours and watches as jewellery are not acceptable.

REMINDERS

- Hoodies, jackets, caps and non-regulation jumpers/tops/jackets/cardigans are not to be worn in the building
- No jewellery, makeup or nail polish
- All headscarves must be plain black
- Long hair should be tied back for activities
- Black school jackets should be worn around the school at all times
- In labs and studios the apron provided should be worn
- All belongings must be labelled and named
- If students have a uniform issue they must contact their tutor with a note from their parent/carer
- Students should bring a sturdy school bag and a pencil case containing black pens, pencils, a ruler, a rubber, a geometry set and calculator
- If a student has an issue with any of the above, they should explain to their personal tutor
